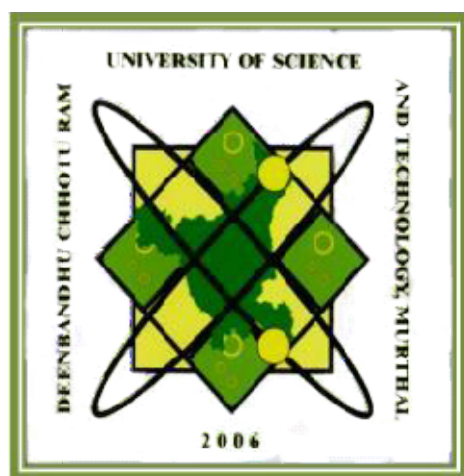

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Ph.D. PROSPECTUS: 2026-27 (Odd Semester)

Deenbandhu Chhotu Ram University of Science & Technology, Murthal offers research programmes in its Departments/Centers leading to the award of Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.). The award of Ph.D. degree is in recognition of high academic achievements, independent research and application of knowledge to the solution of technical and scientific problems in Science, Technology, Architecture, Management and Humanities. The procedure and requirements spelled out in Ordinances and Regulations embody the philosophy to ensure high standards of performance in research work at the University. Notwithstanding these Ordinances and Regulations, various Departments and Centers may require the candidates to complete additional requirements so as to serve their particular academic goals. Ph.D. degree of Deenbandhu Chhotu Ram University of Science & Technology, Murthal shall be conferred on a candidate who fulfills the requirements specified in the Ordinances and Regulations.

This prospectus shall be applied for admission in Ph.D. Programme (August 2026) and onwards, offered by this University, prepared in accordance with University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022. Henceforth, Ph. D. prospectus 2024-25 (even semester) stands suppressed.

1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

The following are eligible to seek admission to the Ph.D. programme:

1.1 Minimum Qualification

- 1.1.1 A 1-year/2-semester master's degree programme after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree programme or a 2-year/4-semester master's degree programme after a 3-year bachelor's degree programme or qualifications declared equivalent to the master's degree by the

corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed or equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of the educational institution.

- 1.1.2 In exceptional cases, the applicants with a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree having a minimum of 8 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) or 75% marks in aggregate and having proven research capability may also be considered eligible.
 - 1.1.3 Candidates who have completed the M. Phil. programme with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed or equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of educational institutions, shall be eligible for admission to the PhD programme. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.
- 1.2 In case, the equivalence between the percentage of marks and Cumulative Grade Point Average is not defined by the University from where the candidate has obtained the qualifying degree, then the most recent University Grants Commission/All India Council for Technical Education

equivalence criteria shall be applicable.

- 1.3** There shall be no age limit for admission to PhD programmes of the University. *As per Govt. letter no. 42/158/2016-5G51 dated 19.01.2018 issued by the Chief Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, the candidates who have obtained degrees/diploma through distance education mode after getting enrolled during 2001-2005 and also who were admitted after the academic session 2001-2005, their degrees/diploma are to be treated as cancelled. Accordingly, such degrees/diploma will not be considered for admission purposes.*

MHRD, Govt. of India, through an order (vide OM no. 11-15/2011-AR (TS.II) dated 06.12.2012) withdrew the recognition granted to all certificates/qualifications awarded by professional bodies/institutions in the field of technical education. The MHRD further stipulated that from 01.06.2013 onwards the courses for equivalence will cease (Refer AICTE Letter F. No.2-PC/ACITE/Gen. Dust, Edu. Policy/2018/439 Dated: 23.08.2018).

2. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME

- 2.1.** The PhD. Degree will have a minimum and maximum duration, as given below:

2.1.1. PhD Programme shall be for a minimum duration of three (3) years, including course work, and a maximum duration of six (6) years from the date of admission to the PhD programme to Date of PhD Thesis Submission.

2.1.2. Date of admission will be the date of Fee submission by the candidate.

- 2.2.** A maximum of an additional two (2) years can be given through a process of re-registration and extension as per the Clause 12.4 of this ordinance; provided, however, that the total period for completion of a PhD programme should not

exceed eight (8) years from the date of admission in the PhD programme. Provided further that, female PhD scholars and Persons with Disabilities (having more than 40% disability) may be allowed an additional relaxation of two (2) years; however, the total period for completion of a PhD programme in such cases should not exceed ten (10) years from the date of admission in the PhD programme. These extensions are not a matter of right and shall be granted solely on the merit of the case.

2.3. Extension shall ordinarily be granted for one year at a time and in no case shall the total extension exceed the maximum period prescribed as:

3. ADMISSION PROCESS

3.1 Admission notice seeking applications for Ph.D. programme shall be issued once or twice in a year i.e., Odd Semester (July to December) and Even semester (January to June). The course work shall also be conducted two times accordingly.

3.3 Haryana State reservation policy will be followed to distribute the total number of slots and is subject to any change/amendments by the State Governments from time to time.

For the distribution of slots, refer to the seat matrix given at page no. 26.

- i. Only the candidates having a permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for the admission of the course) will be considered for admission as physically disabled. A disability certificate must be issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District.
- ii. In the event of quota reserved for physically disabled remain un-utilized due to non-availability for suitable category of disabled candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Serviceman and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).
- iii. The criteria for exclusion of persons within the Backward Class as creamy layer notified vide Notification No. 40/13/2024-1SW dated 16th July, 2024 by Haryana Government Social Justice, Empowerment, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes and Antyodaya (SEWA) Department will be applicable. The Haryana Govt. vide above said notification has notified the following: "No. 40/13/2024-1SW - In exercise of the powers conferred under clause (d) of section 2 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admission in Educational Institutions) Act, 2016 (15 of 2016), and in supersession of the Haryana Government, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, notification No. 491-SW(1)-2021 dated the 17th November, 2021, the Governor of Haryana hereby specifies the criteria for exclusion of persons within the Backward Classes as Creamy Layer as specified in schedule (refer Appendix A):".
- iv. CWP No. 3220 of 2019, Rakesh Dhundhara Vs Union of India and others are pending in Hon'ble Supreme Court regarding 10% reservation granted to the economically weaker section in admission by Govt.
- v. Conversion of reserve seats into All India Category / Open General Category is not permitted. However, the merging of sub-categories like BC (A) &

BC(B) and SC & DSC are permitted if candidates are not available in the sub-category/ list exhausted.

- vi. EWS quota: These seats are the part of HOGC in Ph.D. seat matrix. In case, candidate is not available in EWS category then these seats may be filled from the HOGC candidates
- vii. Reserve category candidate(s) are also eligible in General Category (AIC / HOGC) provided that they scored qualifying marks in entrance examination (Clause 1.1.1 of Prospectus) & qualifying marks in entrance examination should be ≥ 50 (Clause 3.7 of Prospectus).
- viii. Similarly, Reserve category candidate(s) with valid GATE / NET/ JRF/ /CEED and similar National level tests are also eligible in General Category (AIC/ HOGC) provided that they have scored at least equal to the qualifying score for general category candidates in the respective examination tests.
- ix. Reserve Category candidates belonging to SC, DSC, BCA & BCB are not eligible for EWS Category.
- x. Eligibility of the candidates shall be checked at the time of presentation before DRC only. Ineligible candidates qualified in the entrance test shall not be allowed to appear in Seminar/Presentation/Interview to be conducted by respective DRC.

In case of Ph.D. through Part-time Mode, full-time teachers/officials of parent University must also avail leave from the employer for the duration of Pre Ph.D. Course Work.

- 3.3.1 The candidate seeking admission shall apply online through the University admission portal (<https://dcrustmadm.samarth.edu.in>). The Research Scholars shall be admitted in a two-stage process -

University PhD Entrance Test/UGC-CSIR NET/GATE/GPAT etc. and an Interview. The admission into the PhD programme shall be based either on Entrance Test conducted by DCRUST or the National Eligibility Test (NET) score earned by the candidates in the UGC-CSIR NET (Category I, II & III) meant for admission into PhD programme.

- 3.4 The applicants will have to take the University Ph.D. Entrance Test and those further shortlisted will be required to appear for interview/viva-voce/presentation. However, candidates who are successful in the eligibility test conducted at national level by UGC/CSIR/DBT/ICMR/ICSSR for the award of JRF within the permitted validity period of these awards or have a valid score in GATE / NET/ CEED and similar National level tests are exempted from the Entrance Test. **However, candidates covered under the exempted categories may also appear in the entrance test**, if they so desire, to improve their weightage (Refer Clause 3.10.).
- 3.5 Candidates who are exempted from the Entrance Test in Clause 3.4 may also approach the respective Departments or Centres round the year to apply for admission to Ph.D. programme except during the period of process of Ph.D. admission **(from the date of initiation of obtaining the Ph.D. Slots to the date of final admission).**The respective DRC/CRC will verify the eligibility followed by presentation by the applicant and the interview for making a decision regarding admission of the candidates. If selected, the applicants will be admitted to the research programme. They will have to register for Pre-Ph.D. course in the same or subsequent semester(s) also. **These filled Ph.D. slots are considered as integral part of Ph.D. seat matrix for next Ph.D. admission.**
- 3.6 A relaxation of 5 % marks will be allowed in the entrance examination for the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/differently-abled category, Economically Weaker Section (EWS), and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time in the entrance examination conducted by the University. Minimum qualifying marks do not guarantee admission. Final admission shall be made on the basis of criterion prescribed in Clause 3.10.
- 3.7 The Entrance Test syllabus shall consist of 50% of research methodology and 50% shall be subject specific. The Entrance Test shall be a Single Paper Test having 100 Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) and duration of test shall be 120 Minutes. The candidates shall be required to answer all questions. There will be

no negative marking for wrong answers. The Entrance Test shall be divided in two parts.

(a) Part 'A' Research methodology

Part-A shall consist of 50 MCQs each carrying one mark. The questions which will be of general nature, intended to assess the teaching / research aptitude of the candidate. It will primarily be designed to test reasoning ability, comprehension, divergent thinking and general awareness of the candidates.

(b) Part 'B'

This part shall contain 50 subjects specific MCQs covering the topics given in the syllabus and are designed to test a candidate's knowledge of the subject in which he/she has applied for Ph.D. admission.

3.8 The successful applicants, i.e. eligible applicants, who have secured 50 % marks in the University PhD entrance test are eligible to be called for the interview, or otherwise exempted under Clause 3.4 shall be judged by the Department Research Committee (DRC) through interview/viva-voce/presentation. A department document verification committee will verify the eligibility conditions and other required documents with originals before allowing him/her to appear for an interview. The list of candidates eligible for interview will be declared and any complaint by the candidate regarding his/her eligibility will be dealt with by the concerned department's chairperson. Marks of entrance test will not be disclosed till the interview committee awards the marks for interview. The successful applicants, i.e. eligible applicants, who qualify the University PhD entrance test/NET/Valid GATE score or otherwise exempted under Clause shall appear before the PhD Interview Committee through interview/viva-voce/presentation.

3.9 The interview/viva-voce/presentation shall also consider the following aspects, viz. whether:

- a) The candidate possesses the competence for the proposed research;
- b) The research work can be suitably undertaken at the department/centre;

c) The proposed area of research can contribute to new/additional knowledge.

3.10 The DRC after due assessment of the candidate's competence for the proposed research area of research and its contribution to knowledge and also taking due note of vacancy available in the research area will prepare a merit list. Number of vacant slots may be decreased depending on the suitability of applicants.

3.10 (A) Criteria for preparation of Merit Lists for admission

Admissions to the PhD programme shall be carried out in the following order of priority:

3.10 (A.1) Priority-I: JRF Qualified sponsored candidates

- i. Candidates possessing a valid Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) shall be considered first.
- ii. The candidates having qualified for fellowship/scholarship in UGC-NET/UGC-CSIR-NET/DBT/DST/ICMR/CEED/ASRB/GPAT (valid) and similar national level tests, UGC-National Fellowship for Schedule Caste/OBC students (NFSC/NFOBC)/HSCST-JRF (valid) with qualified certificate with JRF award letter/Provisional DST Inspire Fellowship (one year validity subject to the final offer of fellowship as per criteria of DST failing which admission to PhD shall be treated cancelled) shall be exempted from taking Entrance Test but they are required to appear for interview.
- iii. All JRF-qualified sponsored candidates shall be required to appear in the interview. A minimum of 40% marks in the interview shall be mandatory for eligibility for admission.
- iv. A merit list shall be prepared on the basis of interview marks, and admissions shall be offered against the available seats.
- v. JRF-qualified candidates shall be considered for admission only against the category corresponding to their valid JRF.
- vi. If seats are still vacant, the Priority-II as given below shall be considered.

3.10 (A.2) Priority-II: NET For Non Engg. /GATE for Engg. Qualified Candidates

- i. In the event that seats remain vacant after exhausting the Priority-I merit list and waiting admissions shall be offered to NET-qualified candidates.
- ii. The merit shall be determined on the basis of:
 - a. NET/Valid GATE/GPAT qualified Score: Marks scaled down to out of 70.
 - b. Interview: Out of a Maximum of 30 marks
 - c. Total Score= NET/GATEscore (70 marks) + Interview Score (30 marks)
- iii. A category-wise merit list shall be prepared based on the total score obtained by the candidates.

3.10(A.3) Priority-III: NET For Engg. /GATE for Non Engg. Qualified Candidates

- i. If seats remain vacant after exhausting the Priority-II merit list and waiting list, admissions shall be offered to GATE-qualified candidates. The selection procedure and weightages shall remain the same as prescribed for Priority-II:
- ii. The merit shall be determined on the basis of:
 - a. Valid GATE/GPAT Score: Marks scaled down to out of 70
 - b. Interview: Out of a Maximum of 30 marks
 - c. Total Score= GATE/GPAT score (70 marks) + Interview Score (30 marks)
- iii. A category-wise merit list shall be prepared based on the total score obtained by the candidates.

3.10 (A.4) Priority-IV: University Written Test Candidates:

Thereafter, any remaining vacant seats shall be filled from candidates appearing through the University Written Test. The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of the prescribed selection criteria approved by the University. The merit shall be determined on the basis of:

- a. University PhD Entrance Exam Score: Marks scaled down to out of 70.
- b. Interview: Out of a Maximum of 30 marks.
- c. Total Score = University PhD Entrance Exam Score (70 marks)

+ Interview Score (30 marks)

- d. The result of Entrance Test will be considered for admission to Ph.D. only during the semester in which the test was held and the same will not be considered in the subsequent semester(s), that is, **if a candidate wants to be considered for admission next semester/year, he/she will have to appear for the entrance test afresh.**

3.10 (B)

Research personnel appointed under a sponsored research project and seeking admission to the Ph.D. programme shall fulfill all prescribed eligibility criteria for admission. Candidates who are not exempted from the written entrance examination in accordance with this Ordinance shall be required to qualify the University entrance test and appear before the Interview Committee. Upon selection, such candidates shall ordinarily be registered under the supervision of the Principal Investigator (PI) of the sponsored research project, provided that the Principal Investigator is an approved Ph.D. Supervisor under this Ordinance.

3.10 (C) Cut-off for Selection

Only those candidates who secure **at least 33% marks in the interview** shall be eligible for admission. However, SC/ST/BC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) candidates may be permitted a relaxation of 5% marks in the eligibility requirement of interview as well.

3.10 (D) Preparation Of Merit List and Admission Recommendation by Concerned DRC

Merit list shall be prepared only for those candidates who qualify the interview as per Clause 3.10 (C).

A category-wise merit list shall be prepared by the DRC based on the total score obtained by the candidates.

The recommendations of the Department Research Committee (DRC), including the merit list of candidates recommended for admission, shall be submitted to the Dean Academic Affairs for approval. (Chairman, DRC is requested to provide: the merit list of all candidates who appeared for the interview, the attendance sheet, the category-wise list of candidates recommended for admission, the written entrance examination, and all other relevant records pertaining to the admission process). Upon approval by the Dean Academic Affairs, the Academic Branch shall notify the provisional list of selected candidates, together with the schedule and instructions for reporting, final document verification by academic branch, fee payment, and completion of admission formalities, preferably within one week of the DRC meeting. The Academic Branch will issue admission letters subject to final verification of documents and proof of fees deposited. The date of reporting in the Department/Centre concerned shall be specified in the admission letter.

3.10 (E) Waiting List

Along with the list of selected candidates, a category-wise waiting list shall also be prepared by DRC and notified. In the event that a selected candidate fails to accept the admission offer within the stipulated time, the offer shall be extended to candidates in the waiting list in the order of merit in the next round of admission.

3.10 (F) Conversion of Seats

If the waiting list of a particular category is exhausted and seats remain vacant in that category, such vacant seats may be converted and offered to eligible candidates from other categories in accordance with the seat-conversion rules approved by the University and applicable reservation norms in next/subsequent round(s) of admission.

The admission criteria prescribed under this Ordinance shall be subject to such modifications as may become necessary in consequence of regulations, guidelines, or notifications issued from time to time by the

University Grants Commission (UGC) or any other competent statutory or regulatory authority, as adopted and notified by the University. Admissions shall also be made in accordance with the reservation policy of the Central Government/State Government, as applicable, and as adopted by the University from time to time.

The DRC shall ensure that all University rules are followed in the admission process.

3.10 (G) Admission Against Super Numerary Seats

Admission to such seats will be only with the regular admission process i.e. two times in a year (odd Semester and even Semester).

The seats for Residents of Murthal & International students will be treated super numerary in nature and admissions against these seats will be subject to the prior consent of supervisor in the departments/center (one supervisor may give consent to one candidate only) as per eligibility and availability of seats under him/her mentioned under Clause 10.6 of this Ordinance.

One supernumerary seat per year across the university shall be allowed for Residents Of Murthal. Eligibility and other processes of admission shall be as per clauses 6 & 8. For more than one eligible ROM candidate across the departments in a faculty admission will be finalized by FRC and if more than one eligible ROM candidate across the university from different faculties admission will be finalized by Research Board as per clause-8. COE will provide the list of ROM applicants to FRC/RB and chairperson DRC will provide all other documents to FRC/RB. Other procedures will remain the same as defined in this ordinance and general guidelines for ROM will be as defined by the university for other programmes.

3.10(H) Admission for International students against other supernumerary seats:

Each Supervisor can guide up to two international research scholars on a supernumerary basis over and above the permitted number of PhD scholars as specified as per DCRUST Ph.D. Ordinance 2026/UGC Guidelines.

Foreign nationals/OCI shall be exempted from the written test but must appear in the interview in online/physical mode. Their merit will be prepared based on their performance at the interview and will be admitted accordingly.

The medium of instructions shall be English only.

The admission of foreign nationals/OCI shall be subject to the verification of equivalence of their qualifying degrees from the Association of Indian Universities.

Scholars joining the University as foreign nationals/OCI shall be offered Fellowships, in Indian currency, as per the policy of University as notified from time to time.

Anything not defined here will be as per guidelines/norms for international students, notified by the university from time to time.

3.11

The University shall maintain a list of Ph.D. supervisors (specifying the name of the supervisor, his or her designation, and the department/school/centre), along with the details of Ph.D. scholars (specifying the name of the registered Ph.D. scholar, the topic of his/her research and the date of admission under them on the website of the institution and the same id to be updated after every admission process.

4 PRE- Ph.D. COURSE WORK

The admitted candidates will be allowed to register for Pre-Ph.D. Courses after their

admission as per DCRUST Ph.D Ordinance 2026.

4.1 Course Work And Credits

All research students shall have to complete the specified course work as per the academic semester schedule. Details are given in Ph.D. ordinance 2026.

6 ENTRANCE TEST & SYLLABUS (for Non JRF/NET/GATE Candidates)

6.1 Candidates seeking admission to Ph.D. programme shall have to appear in the Entrance Test. The eligible applicants will have to qualify the prescribed Entrance Test meant for registration to Ph.D. programme. For detailed information see Clause 3 of admission process.

6.2 Entrance Tests for admission to various Ph.D. programmes shall be conducted at

University level on the basis of prescribed syllabi of concerned discipline.

6.3 A candidate can apply for admission to one department/discipline only. The entrance test will be held at the University Campus as per the schedule.

- For Research Methodology (RM) part, consult any standard RM book.

6.5 The entrance test shall be a single paper test of 120 minutes duration consisting of 100 multiple choice questions. The candidates shall be required to answer all questions.

6.6 There shall be no negative marking.

6.7 Important Instructions to the candidates for appearing in Entrance Test

- The Candidate must bring his / her Admit Card to appear in the test.

- The Candidates will be provided with a computer system in case of online examination and a question booklet along with OMR Sheet for offline examination.
- In case of online examination, the Candidates are advised to contact the HELP DESK at University Computer Centre, Saraswati Library Building, DCRUST Murthal, at least 30 minutes before the scheduled start of examination to get their computer system location. (The venue of examination shall be notified on the university website/admit card).
- No candidate will be allowed to take the entrance examination 15 minutes after the scheduled start of the examination.

8.1 University Scholarship/Assistance-Ship

University Scholarship/Assistance-ship by the University will be offered to the Topper/toppers of Pre Ph.D. course work undergone in the University as per University Research Scholarship (URS) rules, provided the candidate is not availing any other scholarship. Till 2023-24, one URS was offered in each department per batch. **However, one additional University Research Scholarship (URS) fellowship in different departments has been approved by Academic Council and the Finance Committee to be funded by Students Fund; effective for students admitted henceforth, i.e. 2024-25 (odd semester) onwards.** In case, two or more candidates have the same highest SGPA in course work, then topper(s) shall be decided by existing rule to break the tie; as used to award Gold-Medal.

8.2 Other Scholarships

The students can avail the scholarships granted by other organizations like UGC /CSIR/AICTE etc.

9 COUNSELING AND ADMISSION

9.1 The final eligibility of candidates shall be determined at the time of presentation/interview before Departmental Research Committee to be conducted by the respective departments and accordingly the admissions shall

be made as per Ph.D. Ordinance 2026.

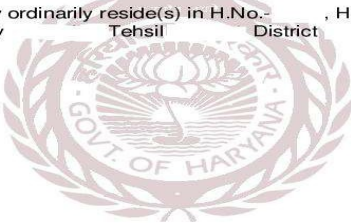
