The Government of Maharashtra has funded through special grant to strengthen the Research & Development (R&D) activities that are observed in main campus, sub-campuses and all affiliated colleges spread over 4 districts of Marathwada region. This center is aimed to facilitate the instrumentation and analytical requirements in basic and applied sciences at academic, research, and industrial fields.

At present, the state-of-art infrastructure including High Resolution Liquid Chromatograph Mass Spectrometer (HRLCMS), Field Emission Scanning Electron Microscope (FESEM), Raman Spectrometer, Gas Chromatography Mass Spectrometry (GCMS), Refractometer, Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometer (AAS,) Reactors and CADD Software (Biovia Discovery Studio) have been procured. The inclusion of few more equipment like Fluorescence Spectroscope, Density & Sound Velocity Meter, Viscometer, Zetasizer Nano Zs, Illumina MiniSeq Platform of NGS for Genome Sequencing, Fluorescent Microscope, X-Ray Powder Diffraction (XRD) and Western Blot is under progress. Other Facilities at the Sub-Centre

The Central Library: It has 497.37 sq m area to accommodate stack room, reference block, issue counter, well equipped reading hall, Asstt. Librarian's cabin, e-Journal lab., office and WCs. It is managed by a qualified Asstt. Librarian and other supporting staff. There are 7636 books of 4280 titles available to students and staff. National Journals, magazines and News papers are regularly procured by the library. The library is connected to international e-Journals database through INFLIBNET facilities. There are separate units for Competitive Examinations, and for Distance Education. The regular activities of the library are computerized with SOUL software–2 version an OPAC operations.

The Computer Laboratories: There are 08 computer labs for the students with latest computer hardware and software installations. The computers are maintained by a qualified Computer staff and by hired experts.

Internet Facility: All computer Labs, PCs with the faculties, at Library and in offices are connected with broadbandnon-stop Internet facility from BSNL and under NKN project of Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India.

Students' Recreation Halls: There are separate recreation halls for Boys and Girls provided with news papers, magazines and table games in each school.

Placement Unit: Each school coordinates placement activities of students for their project work and future job prospects. It is assisted by senior faculties. The placement officer of the university provides inputs to the units as per demand of organizations. Accordingly, Industrial houses, Firms, Financial institutions, Banks, NGOs, Academic/ Research institutions and other private recognized organizations are invited to interact with the students for selection, training and recruitment. Each year, a good number of students from each school are finding suitable jobs through this unit.

Fees, Scholarships, Stipend and Earn and Learn schemes benefits:

All admissions are made as per merit and reservation rules and Fees of every course is collected as per notification of the university with free ship, scholarship and stipend benefits to eligible students as per provisions of Govt. of Maharashtra and Govt. of India. Other economically poor students are enrolled under Earn and Learn scheme to partially support their financial requirements. Poor meritorious Girl students are also adopted by the university in bearing their educational expenditure. Similarly, donations received from staff and philanthropists support SWAS scheme to provide financial help to most needy students of the region in view of water scarcity area and poor economic conditions.

4.0 SOFT SKILL PROGRAMME

5.0 COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS GUIDANCE CENTRE

This center was inaugurated in academic year 2015-2016. Currently, this center is located on second floor of Knowledge Resource Center (KRC). The main aim of this center is to give training to students aspiring for MPSC / UPSC examinations. Number of notable IAS/IPS officers including Shri. Anand Patil, Shri. Santosh Ajmera, Shri. Sameer Unhale, Dr. Nilesh Sangade etc., have visited this center in recent past & inculcated aptitude for such competitive exams. among our students.

Our University has signed MoU with The Unique Academy, Pune and The Competitors Foundation, Pune. As an outcome of it, till date, three six month training programmes for such competitive exams. have been arranged in our campus successfully. Usually, the classes of

these training programmes are held on Sunday, so that students studying in different institutes in jurisdiction of our University can get maximum benefit. The experts from the Unique Academy, Pune used to teach and clarify doubts of the participants.

In order to commemorate Silver Jubilee year of our University, the centre arranged 'Vice-Chancellor Competitive Exam. Trophy' between 15-23 Feb. 2019 in collaboration with the unique Academy Pune and The Competitors Foundation, Pune. Thirty Eight Colleges under Jurisdiction of the University have actively Participated in this mega event.

The first prize winner has been awarded with cash prize of Rs. 31,000/-, memento and certificate, the second winner has been awarded with cash prize of Rs. 21,000/-, memento and certificate, whereas third prize winner has been awarded with cash prize of Rs. 11,000/-, memento and certificate. This event was highly appreciated by all participating institutes. Such kind of events will be organized regularly.

6.0 RULES FOR ADMISSION

1. For admission PG programme students have to earn minimum 24 credits in the concerned /allied subject at UG level as per the University /UGC norms.
2. Admission schedule declared by the university is to be strictly followed at every school.
3. On the date of admission, the selected students must submit all required original documents.
4. The prescribed full fees and deposits have to be paid by the selected students on the day of admission.
5. Privilege in payment of fees only to reserved category students has to be duly excised after verification of documents and previously obtained GOI number/certificate. But, prescribed deposits have to be paid by the reserve category student.
6. If a selected student does not take admission by the due date, his/her candidature will be reconsidered only during spot admission following a fresh merit list.
7. At the time of spot admission if seats are vacant from reservation categories, based on merit, such category students will be admitted first and then remaining seats will be filled up as per open merit.
8. After the date of spot admission if there are any vacant seats the concerned School Director with the approval of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor may admit eligible students.
9. All admitted students are required to submit an undertaking with regards to regular class attendance, participation in all internal evaluation process, anti-raging and other disciplinary measures.
10. Admission of a student will be granted only to one programme at a time, even if he/she is eligible for more than one programme.

6.1 PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION

- (A) Admissions to the above courses will be given strictly on merit / CET basis.
- (B) Candidate must have studied the subject at the qualifying examination as one of the optional subjects (Wherever necessary).
- (C) A candidate shall be admitted to the first year course of the masters degree in the faculty as the case may be provided she/he satisfies the following condition:-
Candidate must have passed the Bachelor's Degree examination in the concerned faculty of this university or an examination of the university recognized as equivalent thereto.
- (D) Whereas aggregate marks obtained in the degree course (I,II & III year) will be considered for preparing the merit list for those courses where marks obtained in the optional subject is not compulsory.
- (E) The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate in entrance examination (wherever applicable) provided that in case of the relative merit of different candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below
 - (i) Percentage of marks in the concern subject at UG (wherever applicable).
 - (ii) Percentage of aggregate marks in UG
 - (iii) Percentage of marks at HSC
 - (iv) Daite of birth

6.2 DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS:

1. 70% Seats for SRTM U., Nanded students.
2. 30% Seats for other Universities students in Maharashtra.
3. Over and above quota, 20% Seats for other States in India and 25% Seats for other Countries.
4. Seats remaining vacant from the quota of other Universities (30%) in Maharashtra shall be filled by priority from S.R.T.M. University, Nanded and then from other State Universities.
5. Seats remaining vacant from the quota of S.R.T.M. University, Nanded (70%) shall be filled by priority from other University in Maharashtra and then from other State Universities.

6.4 ATTENDANCE & RULES OF DISCIPLINE:

Students admitted to Campus Schools will have to be regular in their classes. If their attendance is below 75% in the class room they will not be allowed to appear for the university examinations. Every student of Campus School will have to follow all the rules of discipline and the code of conduct together with amendments effected from time to time framed by the university.

6.5 RULES FOR CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION AND REFUND OF FEES/DEPOSIT

1. If a student fails to submit the required documents at the time and date of admission, his/her selection to admission will be treated as cancelled.
2. Admission of the student is treated as cancelled who does not comply with the conditions listed in admission rule no. 6.4, and who does not fulfill the essential requirements for completing the term and program.
3. There will be no refund of any fees to a student, whose admission to a program is treated as cancelled as per the rules mentioned above. Only deposit amount will be refunded.
4. After completing admission, student who does not comply with eligibility requirements and/or fails to fill up university semester examination forms cannot claim continuity of his/her admission to that program that year or year after. He/she has to go for fresh admission procedure as per rule next year. If he/she gets admission next year, then prescribed fees of that year have to be paid afresh.
5. A student, who took admission with fees concession (as per Govt or University provisions) but his/her admission is cancelled due to any reason has to pay the full fees before taking TC.
6. In case of cancellation of admission by the student, 10% deduction will be made and the balance amount will be refunded upto spot admission only. Under any circumstances refund of fees will not be made after spot admission.

7.0 SPECIAL COACHING FOR SC/ST/OBC(NON-CREAMY LAYER), MINORITIES AND ALL GIRL STUDENTS

Student from the SC/ST are the most deprived and oppressed groups of Indian Society. In order to safeguard their interests and to improve the status of these students socially and educationally, a special scheme sponsored by UGC, New Delhi, viz, remedial coaching and entry in services is implemented in each school of the SRTM university from the academic year 2011-2012 onwards. “Remedial coaching is helpful to improve the overall skills while “entry in services is useful to prepare the students to gain employment in state and central services.

12. FACILITIES

13.1 Knowledge Resource Center (Central Library):

The Knowledge Resource Centre building located at the centre of all Campus Schools has a rich collection of books, journals, bound volumes, theses, reports and other reading material. The KRC has automated its services and provides circulation, Web OPAC, reference, referral, SMS, wifi, etc. services. Entire theses collection in the KRC is the digitized and is available on Shodhganga. The KRC is member of Shodhsindhu and has access to huge online resource. A well furnished study-room, Swami Ramanand Teerth Memorial and different sections of the KRC are places of attraction for the students.

13.2 Sports, Gymnasium Facilities and Health Centre:

The University gives due importance to the overall development of students and their recreational needs. For this purpose, volley-ball, basket-ball, kabaddi and kho-kho courts are on the University Campus.

Facility of well-equipped ladies and gents gymnasium is available on campus. Health Centre with all primary medical facilities is also available for health care under supervision of competent staff.

13.3 Facility for Differently Abled Persons:

The Differently abled students avail various softwares, computers and other equipments for effective learning. Ramps, railing, lift etc facilities are also provided on the campus to facilitate them smoothly. Various academic and recreational activities are organized for the students.

13.4 Career Counselling and Placement Cell:

The University has in place a Career Counselling and Placement Cell. Various Seminars, Workshops and Campus Interviews are organized by the Cell. The Cell has established effective coordination amongst Campus Schools, Industries and other Organizations.

13.5 Hostel Accommodation:

Separate hostel facilities for girls and boys are available on the university campus. The admission to the hostel is strictly given on the merit basis to P.G. students of all campus schools. The quota for each school is decided on demand and supply basis. There are four boys' hostels in campus. The intake capacity of boys hostel is 300. There are four girls' hostel in campus including one minority girls hostel. The intake capacity of girls hostel is 344. Capacity of minority girls hostel is 100 and admission for it is given as per the rules of the State Govt. of Maharashtra. The mess of girls hostel is run on co-operative basis and shall be compulsory for each student-hostelite.

This centre is especially for the isolation of active constituents from the herbs through equipments available in the centre like Preparative HPLC and flash system. The development opportunity under this project is to provide basic equipment facilities which is not only useful for the isolation of actives from locally available medicinal herbs but also for the technology transfer to researchers of University, students of Campus Schools, colleges affiliated to University, Industry and other University staff.

The RUSA centre is serving as a hub for isolation of actives from the herbal plants and also technology start-ups and will actively identify and provide for the value-added services required to support incubator clients (academic institution and industries).

The RUSA centre is presently having sophisticated instruments like fully automated preparative HPLC and Flash system, Microplate reader, Nano drop UV Vis spectrophotometer, Lyophilizer, Flame Photometer, All Purpose Equipment (Granulation of Solid Oral), Fluid bed dryer, Electromagnetic Sieve Shaker With accessories, Analytical Balance, Wensar Weighing Balance Rota evaporator, Digital potentiometer, digital pH conductometer, melting point/ boiling point apparatus, muffle furnace, circulating water bath, water purification system HPLC grade water, Clevenger apparatus, hot air oven, Olympus Microscope (Compound), Ultrasonic Bath, spray dryer etc. These instrumentation facilities may be availed by researcher, students and researchers of colleges affiliated to University, Industry and other University staff on minimum charge bases.

13.7 DAY CARE CENTRE:

The University Provides Day Care Centre facility to the Children of regular full time Teachers, Researchers and Students.

13. GENERAL RULES AND SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- a) All admissions will be given on merit basis.
- b) Students should read the prospectus carefully before filling the admission form.
- c) Students should note the procedure of admission and time-table.
- d) M.B.A., M.C.A., B. Pharm. and M. Pharm. courses are governed by AICTE rules and DTE admissions procedure.
- e) All admissions given in the campus schools are as per the University rules and regulations.
- f) No correspondence will be made with regard to admission. The students should read the merit list displayed in the school concerned on the date mentioned in the prospectus.
- g) Claims on refund will not be considered after the deadline.
- h) The candidate must remain present with all the original documents.
- i) No student will be given admission after the deadline.
- j) Incomplete admission forms will not be considered.
- k) If the necessary documents are not attached with the application forms, the application forms will not be accepted. No concession of time will be given to those who do not attach the necessary documents.
- l) It is necessary to fulfil the required condition/qualification that the university has recommended for the postgraduate course concerned.
- m) The students of arts, commerce and science faculties who have passed the compulsory or second language will be eligible for admission to M. A. in the respective language.
- n) Required percentage as decided by the university is essential for admission to the courses related to AICTE.
- o) The students, who will be eligible for admission to the courses, will be subject to the eligibility conditions of the university.
- p) The students who have completed first year from the other universities or affiliated colleges will not be eligible for admission to the second year of the postgraduate course.

14. ANTI-RAGGING REGULATION

Ragging is legally banned. It is a punishable offence. In view of the increasing number of events of ragging, the University Grants Commission has passed the “UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009.

Ragging is any conduct by “any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or including in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in any ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing of power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.”

The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments namely;

- i) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- ii) Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
- iii) Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
- iv) Withholding results.
- v) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc. vi) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- vii) Cancellation of admission
- viii) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- ix) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

The students are devised to consult the Anti-Ragging Committee in case of emergency.

रॅगिंग करणे हा कायदानुसार गुन्हा आहे. रॅगिंगच्या वाढत्या घटनांमुळे विद्यापीठ अनुदान आयोगाने २००९ मध्ये रॅगिंग करणाऱ्याला कठोर शिक्षेची तरतूद असलेला अधिनियम प्रसारित केला. रॅगिंग संदर्भात या विद्यापीठात ‘रॅगिंग प्रतिबंधक समिती’ स्थापन करण्यात आली असून या अधिनियमाची कठोर अंमलबजावणी विद्यापीठात केली जाणार आहे. रॅगिंग हा दुसऱ्या विद्यार्थ्याला शारीरिक किंवा मानसिक क्लेश होईल असे वर्तन करण्याचा एक घृणास्पद अमानवी व विकृत प्रकार आहे. रॅगिंगमुळे निष्पाप विद्यार्थ्यांचे खच्चीकरण तर होतेच, परंतु रॅगिंगमुळे प्रसंगी एखादा विद्यार्थी प्राणासही मुकू शकतो रॅगिंगमध्ये खालील बाबींचा अंतर्भाव होतो नव प्रवेशित विद्यार्थ्याला बोलून, लिहून, चिडवून, उध्दटपणे वागून त्याला/तिला मानसिक किंवा शारीरिक इजा पोहचविणे इतरांची मानहानी करणारे व लज्जा उत्पन्न करणारे वर्तन करणे.

नवप्रवेशित विद्यार्थ्यांवर वरिष्ठत्वाच्या नात्याने जोरजुलूम करणे, दहशत उत्पन्न करणे, सत्ता प्रस्थापित करणे, त्यांना शिक्षा देणे इ. प्रत्यक्ष-अप्रत्यक्षपणे इतर विद्यार्थ्यांना त्रास देणारी कोणतीही कृती करणे.
